#### **SPELLING NOTE:**

This lesson shows the American spelling of the words *Favorite*, *Toward*, and *Practice*. Most other English-speaking countries spell these words this way: *Favourite*, *Towards*, and *Practise* (when used as a verb; *Practice* when used as a noun). Make it a challenge for your students to find these words in the lesson and see if they know the alternate spellings.
